

CITY COUNCIL

June 4, 2012

The June 4, 2012 City Council meeting was called to order at 8:00 p.m. in Council Chambers by Don Spiegel, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of the United States of America. Mayor Washburn voiced his opinion concerning the water issues being experienced by residents living in the Northeast Water Quadrant and stated that he feels it is time to move on this matter.

It was decided that a special City Council meeting will be held on Monday, June 11, 2012 beginning at 8:00 p.m. to again discuss the Northeast Water Quadrant Project.

It was noted that Columbia Gas is in the process of changing residential meters throughout the City.

Mayor Washburn reported on information received regarding an upcoming increase of seventeen percent (17%) in the State Highway Patrol work force. It was noted that local governments are closely watching their budgets and are being forced to make cuts due partially to revenue cuts by the State while the State government continues to grow.
