A motion was made by Mr. McColly, seconded by Mr. Swinehart, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$16,748.56. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the July 1, 2013 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

It was noted that the signs ordered for limited parking in front of the Wyandot County Council on Aging Office located at 127 South Sandusky Avenue, as discussed in previous meetings, were recently installed.

Mr. Thornton indicated that he stopped at the food pantry recently to meet with Mr. Joseph concerning the pedestrian entrance/exit located directly on the north/south alley on the east side of the building located at 211 West Wyandot Avenue and found that Mr. Joseph as not at the food pantry. It was suggested that since the food pantry is only open one evening each week for only a few hours that saw horses be placed at both ends of the alley during this time. Mr. Thornton indicated that he would discuss this suggestion with Mr. Joseph.

Safety Committee members reviewed a notice from the Ohio Division of Liquor Control to transfer a liquor permit from Heritage IGA Upper Sandusky LLC, 415 West Church Street, to Upper Sandusky Save A Lot LLC, 415 West Church Street. Safety Committee members voiced no objections to the transfer of this permit.

Discussion was held concerning a request received by Mr. Allen Boes, Street and Sanitation Supervisor, for a traffic light at the entrance/exit of River's Edge Subdivision. Mayor Washburn indicated that he was informed that years ago when the subdivision was being developed, the Ohio Department of Transportation said they would look at this area, if needed, for a possible traffic light. It was noted that ODOT has not indicated that a traffic light is needed at this intersection.

Discussion was also held regarding a suggestion to change the direction of the one way alley located adjacent to the Police Department from west to east and therefore change the parking spaces located adjacent to the Police Department to face the east. This would allow police vehicles to exit the alley onto Seventh Street instead of having to travel the alley to get to a nearby street.

Chief Yeater reported the following:

- The Firemens Festival held recently was the most successful one held to date despite rainy weather. A few of the scheduled events were cancelled due to the rain.
- Information is still being gathered on possible grant funding.
- Inspections of local businesses by the Fire Department are being organized, in effort to determine if these businesses meet local fire code.
- The Fire Department is working with a local property owner to obtain a home for burn training. It was noted that a permit from the EPA needs to be obtained for an asbestos abatement for this property. The training will not occur until the fall.

Mayor Washburn reported that he received one complaint concerning the Firemens Festival from a neighbor living nearby the festival area.

Mayor Washburn also indicated that he was contacted by Mrs. Linda Barth, Upper Sandusky High School, concerning the possibility of having a homecoming parade that would begin in town and travel to the fairgrounds. The tentative date set for the parade is September 22, 2013.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
