Mayor Washburn inquired with Mr. MaGinn as to if all firemen have received copies of the City's employee handbook. Mr. MaGinn indicated that all firemen have received and signed for their copies of the City's employee handbook.

Safety Committee members reviewed a notice from the Ohio Rail Development Commission concerning the railroad crossing at Reservoir Road. This crossing was previously designated as exempt from the Stop sign requirement but due to increased train traffic on this track the crossing no longer qualifies for exemption. The City is being asked to respond if a determination is made that the crossing should be added to the exempted from the Stop sign requirement list. Safety Committee members agreed to take no action on this matter.

Captain Ross reported that the remodeling at the Police Department is almost completed.

Mr. MaGinn reported that the Fire Department continues to train at the home donated and the home will be burned on April 18.

Mr. MaGinn also reported that testing has been done on all of the Fire Department's fire hose.

Mayor Washburn reported that a donation of \$500.00 was received from Police Officer Andy Silcox and his wife Denise towards the City's canine fund.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
