Chief Ross reported that the civil service examination for the position of Police Captain was administered on August 28, 2017 and the Civil Service Commission is scheduled to meet later this week to certify the results from that examination. The City is currently waiting on the results from the physical examination for a police officer candidate. Chief Ross indicated that he is hopeful that vacancies within the Police Department can be addressed in October.

Chief Ross also reported that the Police Department has been monitoring parking and traffic near Union Elementary/Upper Sandusky Middle School.

Chief Yeater reported that the City's proposed new aerial truck which was located in Huston, Texas is reportedly okay after the recent hurricane that impacted that area. It was noted that legislation will be considered at the City Council meeting to be held later this evening for the purchase of this aerial truck and the loan financing and grant award available for this aerial truck.

Chief Yeater also reported that the interview process for new volunteers within the Fire Department will begin soon.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
