A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Wessler, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$16,198.22. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the March 5, 2018 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

A request was presented to add two handicap parking spaces in the area where the curb is cut near the entrance/exit to the alley which was vacated in 2017, along the east side of North Sandusky Avenue in the 200 block, near Kimmel Cleaners.

A motion was made by Mr. Wessler, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to table further discussion on this matter until additional information is obtained. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Safety Committee members reviewed a notice from Police Officer Allen Foust of his intention to retire from the Police Department on June 2, 2018. Chief Ross indicated that Officer Foust's last day of work will be April 20, 2018 and he will be using his accrued vacation until the date of his retirement.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Wessler, to accept the retirement of Police Officer Allen Foust as of June 2, 2018. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Chief Ross asked the Safety Committee to request the Civil Service Commission to proceed with the administration of a police officer civil service examination to form an eligibility list to fill the vacancy to be created by Officer Foust's retirement.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Wessler, to request the Civil Service Commission to proceed with a civil service examination for the position of Police Officer. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Chief Ross reported that the Police Department's SUV patrol vehicles, recently approved by City Council, are scheduled to be built this month.

Assistant Chief MaGinn reported that the Fire Department's old aerial was sold on govdeals.com to an individual from Georgia for \$10,200.00. This individual picked the aerial truck up last week and drove it back to Georgia.

Assistant Chief MaGinn also reported that the Fire Department will be participating in the Docudrama at the end of this month.

Assistant Chief MaGinn further reported that the City's water line information was submitted to the Insurance Service Office (ISO) as part of the evaluation of the City's fire rating. The Fire Department is still waiting on flow test information so this can also be submitted.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
