The July 2, 2018 Safety Committee meeting was called to order at 4:00 p.m. in Council Chambers by Bill Thornton, Acting Chairman. Safety Committee members present were Bill Thornton and Kenneth Wessler. Rick Roberts was absent.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Wessler, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$8,835.44. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the June 4, 2018 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

Chief Yeater reported that Volunteer Firefighter Matt Vanderpool was successful in getting the Fire Department a \$5,000.00 grant from Columbia Gas for a video competition he participated in regarding the dangers of gas leaks. The grant check was presented and truck improvements are being planned with the money received.

Safety Committee members again discussed a request from Mr. Jake Reel for the placement of “Children at Play” signs in the area of Pleasant View Street and Sycamore Street, as presented at the June 4, 2018 Safety Committee meeting. Considerable discussion was held concerning the placement of these signs in this area. Chief Ross warned that the placement of such signs does not ensure the safety of children playing in the area and parents should still be watching out for their children.

A motion was made by Mr. Wessler, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to approve the placement of two “Children at Play” signs in the area of Pleasant View Street and Sycamore Street, with Chief Ross to provide input on the locations for these signs. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Thornton presented a request from Thiel’s Wheel to utilize the cul de sac on Tarhe Trail with a tent to be set up for their annual Backyard Barbeque to be held this year over a three day period, August 24, 25, and 26, 2018. Mr. Thornton stated that if this request is granted, the roadway must be repaired to the City’s satisfaction following the event.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Wessler, to allow Thiel’s Wheels to utilize the cul de sac on Tarhe Trail for their annual Backyard Barbeque to be held on Friday, August 24, Saturday, August 25, and Sunday, August 26, 2018 with the roadway to be repaired to the City’s satisfaction following the event. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Yeater reported on the following:

- The fire protection contract with Crane Township has been signed and returned. No word has been received from Mifflin or Salem Townships regarding their contracts.
- The Fire Department’s annual Chicken Barbeque will be held on Wednesday, July 4, 2018.
- The paperwork is set for the fireworks to be held at the high school on Friday, July 6, 2018.

Chief Ross requested the Safety Committee enter into an executive session.

A motion was made by Mr. Wessler, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to enter into an executive session to discuss a personnel matter. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried. Upon completion of the executive session, the Safety Committee reconvened into regular session.

There being no further business, the Acting Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
