

CITY COUNCIL

April 15, 2019

The April 15, 2019 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Don Spiegel, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Marc Mays, Rick Roberts, Don Spiegel, Bill Thornton, John Walker, and Kenneth Wessler. Aaron Korte was absent.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Mark Ellis, Law Director; Carol Morehart; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the April 1, 2019 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

The minutes of the April 1, 2019 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the April 1, 2019 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Mays, to place Resolution No. 53-13 entitled, "A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT WITH WYANDOT COUNTY FOR 2019 COMMUNITY HOUSING IMPACT AND PRESERVATION (CHIP) PROGRAM AND DECLARING THIS ACT AN EMERGENCY.", on its second reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Resolution No. 53-13 for the second time by title only.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Walker, for the adoption of Resolution No. 53-13. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried and Resolution No. 53-13 was duly adopted.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to place Ordinance No. 54-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 2-13 AND AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF UPPER SANDUSKY, OHIO TO ENTER INTO AN AMENDED COMMUNITY REINVESTMENT AREA AGREEMENT WITH KIMMEL CLEANERS INC. AND KIMMEL ENTERPRISES.", on its second reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 54-13 for the second time by title only.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Thornton, for the adoption of Ordinance No. 54-13. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance No. 54-13 was duly adopted.

Residents were reminded that Spring Clean-Up will take place April 22 – 26, 2019. The City will not be accepting televisions, computer monitors, paint, tires, bricks, blocks, concrete, railroad ties, yard waste, rocks, large pieces of wood (chunks of trees), hazardous waste, and appliances. Televisions and computer monitors can be taken to the Wyandot County SWMD and Recycling Center at a cost of \$5.00 each on the following Saturdays: March 30, 2019, June 29, 2019, August 31, 2019, and November 23, 2019. The Rod and Gun Club can be contacted to pick up large appliances.

It was noted that plans are proceeding for Casey's General Store, to be located on property at the southwest corner of the intersection of West Wyandot Avenue and South Eighth Street.

It was also noted that construction of the new Water Reclamation Facility is in progress.

Mayor Washburn reported that several companies who shoot off fireworks displays were interviewed recently for the City's 2019 event. It was decided to hire Pyro Technico who were in charge of the City's fireworks display in 2017. Mayor Washburn indicated that the fireworks will be held this year on Friday, July 5, 2019 with a raindate of Sunday, July 7, 2019. Mayor Washburn also noted that letters to potential donors will be mailed soon.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting adjourned.
