

CITY COUNCIL

June 17, 2019

The June 17, 2019 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Rick Roberts, President Pro-Tem. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Bill Thornton, John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, and Rick Roberts. Don Spiegel was absent.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Mark Ellis, Law Director; Bentley Mays; Brody Mays; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the June 3, 2019 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

Mayor Washburn reported that the sale date for a portion of Waterworks Park has been set to be held on Thursday, July 25, 2019 at 6:00 p.m. on the park premises. The night for interested individuals to view the land has been set for Monday, July 15, 2019 from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Washburn noted that the Wyandot Classics and Cruisers car show that was scheduled to be held in Harrison Smith Park on Saturday, June 22, 2019 has been cancelled due to the heavy rainfalls and rescheduled for Saturday, July 20, 2019.

Mayor Washburn also reported that the Street Department will begin grinding the pavement on Walker Street tomorrow, and the crack sealing of other roadways will be done as weather permits.

Mr. Ellis noted that the Fire Department's annual Chicken Barbeque will be held on Thursday, July 4, 2019, with tickets currently on sale at a cost of \$9.00 each, and meals available for pick up at the fire station from 4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Washburn noted that the annual fireworks display will take place at the high school on Friday, July 5, with Sunday, July 7, 2019 being the raindate for this event. Donations are currently being accepted by the City for sponsors.

Mayor Washburn also noted that Wyanstock will be held at the fairgrounds on Friday, July 5, 2019 and Saturday, July 6, 2019.

Mayor Washburn further noted that the first ever Battle of the Badges charity softball game will be held on Saturday, August 24, 2019 in Harrison Smith Park beginning with a homerun derby at 12:00 p.m. and game beginning at 1:00 p.m. The game will feature the Upper Sandusky public safety forces (police and fire department personnel) vs. the Carey public safety forces (police and fire department personnel), with admission being \$5.00 and this including admission to the swimming pool. All proceeds from the event will benefit the Wyandot Memorial Hospital Oncology Services.

There being no further business, the President Pro-Tem declared the meeting adjourned.
