June 10, 2019

The June 10, 2019 Park Board meeting was called to order at 5:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Kenneth Wessler, Chairman. Park Board members present were Jon Blackburn, Jack Leonard, Kip Wentling, and Kenneth Wessler. Aaron Korte was absent.

A motion was made by Mr. Wessler, seconded by Mr. Leonard, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$298,192.61. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the May 13, 2019 Park Board meeting, having been mailed to each Park Board member, were approved as received.

It was noted that the splash pad in Bicentennial Park is getting a lot of use and there was a nice crowd that attended the dedication on May 16, 2019. Mr. Niederkohr was asked to explain the benefit of a fresh water system for the splash pad instead of a recirculated water system. Mr. Niederkohr explained that with the fresh water system that is being used for the splash pad it is connected directly to the City's water system with no other requirements, and with the recirculated water system an underground tank and filters would be required with chlorine to be added and water tests would have to be conducted daily.

Mr. Niederkohr reported that the Ohio Department of Natural Resource grant that funded the splash pad also funded a handicap swing that was recently installed in Bicentennial Park. The yard work around the swing will need to be completed when the weather permits.

Mr. Niederkohr also reported that the Parks Department employees are currently mowing twice per week due to the excessive rainfalls.

Mr. Niederkohr further reported that the Parks Department was selected as one of the four charitable recipients of the 2019 Winter Fantasy of Lights. The project submitted for consideration includes the resurfacing of the tennis court and adjacent basketball court and turning the small basketball court to the west into a pickle ball court; and if funding allows adding LED lighting in this area.

Mr. Leonard inquired as to the status of the sale of a portion of Waterworks Park. It was noted that City Council passed an Ordinance approving the sale of this property at their June 3, 2019 meeting. Mayor Washburn indicated that he spoke with Mr. Paul Wagner, WMS Real Estate and Auction Service, and the auction should be held during the week of July 22-29, 2019. Mayor Washburn will be meeting with Mr. Wagner soon to discuss the details of the auction.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
