

CITY COUNCIL

October 7, 2019

The October 7, 2019 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Rick Roberts, President Pro-Tem. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Bill Thornton, John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, and Rick Roberts. Don Spiegel was absent.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Mark Ellis, Law Director; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the September 16, 2019 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

The minutes of the September 16, 2019 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the October 1, 2019 Civil Service Commission meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

A motion was made by Mr. Mays, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to place Ordinance No. 62-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, ADOPT AND ENACT THE 2019 REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES: TO REPEAL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH: TO PUBLISH THE ENACTMENT OF NEW MATTER: AND DECLARING THIS ACT AN EMERGENCY.", on its second reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President Pro-Tem declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 62-13 for the second time by title only.

A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Walker, for the adoption of Ordinance No. 62-13. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President Pro-Tem declared the motion carried and Ordinance No. 62-13 was duly adopted.

Mr. Roberts announced that the Fall Health Fair for City employees will be held on Tuesday, October 29, 2019 from 6:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the Water Treatment Plant.

It was noted that the members of City Council received the Income Tax Collections and Transient Guest Tax Collections quarterly reports.

City Council members also received the Recapitulation for September 2019.

The appointment of an individual to fill the seat on the Civil Service Commission that was vacated by Mrs. Shelley Beidelschies was again discussed.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to appoint Mr. Dean Leonard to fill the vacant seat on the Civil Service Commission with the term to expire on March 1, 2022. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The President Pro-Tem declared the motion carried.

Mayor Washburn reported that Mr. Doug Keller, recently hired by the Service Committee as the Wastewater Treatment Plant Supervisor, started working today.

Mayor Washburn also reported that Trick-or-Treat will be held on Saturday, October 26, 2019 from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. with the Police Department to hand out candy and the Fire Department to assist by locating fire trucks in certain areas including near the Elks for their Walk Thru. The Halloween Parade, as planned by the American Legion, will take place on Thursday, October 31, 2019.

Mayor Washburn further reported that leaf pick-up within the City will begin soon and residents were reminded not to rake their leaves into the streets.

There being no further business, the President Pro-Tem declared the meeting adjourned.
