

CITY COUNCIL

September 16, 2019

The September 16, 2019 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Don Spiegel, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Don Spiegel, Bill Thornton, John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, and Rick Roberts.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Mark Ellis, Law Director; Mark Droll, City Auditor; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the September 3, 2019 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

The minutes of the September 3, 2019 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the September 9, 2019 Park Board meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

Mr. Droll reviewed the findings from the State audit for 2017 and 2018 with the members of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. Mays, seconded by Mr. Spiegel, to place Ordinance No. 62-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE, ADOPT AND ENACT THE 2019 REPLACEMENT PAGES TO THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES: TO REPEAL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT THEREWITH: TO PUBLISH THE ENACTMENT OF NEW MATTER: AND DECLARING THIS ACT AN EMERGENCY.", on its first reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 62-13 for the first time by title only.

Mr. Spiegel reminded City Council members of the current vacancy on the Civil Service Commission that is an appointment by City Council. Names of any individuals interested in serving should be brought to a future City Council meeting.

It was noted that next week is Fall Clean-Up for residential sanitation customers within the City.

It was also noted that the Wyandot Classics and Cruisers annual car show will take place in the downtown on Saturday, September 28, 2019.

It was further noted that a ceremony will be held on Saturday, September 21, 2019 with the historic Old Mission Church site, located in Old Mission Cemetery, to be returned to the Wyandotte Nation.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting adjourned.
