A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Voorheis, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$303,968.30. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the October 21, 2019 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Service Committee member, were approved as received.

At this time Mr. Bud Miller again addressed the Service Committee regarding a proposed bike path at the north end of the City indicating that he talked with the people who deeded the land of the former Wyandot Manor to the Crane Township Trustees and they've indicated that they have no problems with the proposed bike path. Mr. Miller presented a map of the proposed bike path and noted that a bridge will be necessary to cross the ravine. Mr. Miller introduced Mrs. Pam Zimmerly who indicated that she is researching grant funding for the proposed bike path thru ODNR, ODOT, and the USDA. Mayor Washburn noted that he will further research the matter.

Trapping rights for the reservoir were discussed. It was noted that the trapping rights were advertised and Mr. Steven Webster was the only individual who submitted his name for these rights.

A motion was made by Mr. Rowe, seconded by Mr. Spiegel, to approve Mr. Steven Webster for the 2019/2020 trapping rights for the reservoir. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Service Committee members were presented a complaint received about a high water bill from Mr. Ben Mullins, 100 Pine Ridge Lane. Mr. Schoenberger explained that Mr. Mullins has indicated that he watered his lawn with sprinklers overnight multiple times and Mr. Mullins did not believe that should have caused a high water bill. Mr. Schoenberger noted that Mr. Mullins average usage is 3,000 gallons per month and the usage on the bill in question was 39,000 gallons for the month. Mr. Schoenberger indicated that he offered to check Mr. Mullins' water meter and Mr. Mullins declined this offer. The Service Committee was asked to review the matter.

Mr. Keller reported that construction of the new Water Reclamation Facility is on schedule with the sewer going to the plant line being installed, stone being placed around the headworks, and concrete being poured.

A tour of the new Water Reclamation Facility for members of the Service Committee and City Council will be held on Monday, November 18, 2019 beginning at 4:30 p.m.

Mr. Schoenberger reported that he is still working on the meter program and he will be meeting soon with a representative from Ferguson to obtain a cost comparison.

Mr. Taylor reported that due to the November 11, 2019 Veteran's Day holiday, trash and recycling normally picked up on Monday will instead be picked up on Tuesday, November 12, 2019; and due to the upcoming Thanksgiving holiday, trash and recycling that would have been picked up on Thursday, November 28, 2019 will be picked up on Wednesday, November 27, 2019 and trash and recycling that would have been picked up on Friday, November 29, 2019 will be picked up on Monday, December 2, 2019.

Mayor Washburn indicated that representatives from the City will be ringing the Salvation Army bell at Walmart on Friday, December 6, 2019 for those interested in volunteering.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
