

CITY COUNCIL

June 1, 2020

The June 1, 2020 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. via WebEx by Rick Roberts, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Rick Roberts, John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, and Kyle McColly. Don Spiegel was absent.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Ben Buckland, Law Director; Mark Droll, City Auditor; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the May 18, 2020 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

The minutes of the May 18, 2020 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the May 26, 2020 Board of Zoning Appeals hearing, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the May 27, 2020 special Park Board meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

Discussion was held regarding the fireworks slated for Friday, July 3, 2020 with a raindate of Sunday, July 5, 2020. Mayor Washburn reported that he has been in contact with the company responsible for the fireworks display and the current plan is to proceed with the fireworks unless orders from the Governor's Office change. Mayor Washburn noted that guidelines for observers will be release prior to the event. Mayor Washburn thanked the Upper Sandusky Schools for the use of the high school grounds in conjunction with the event.

Mr. McColly inquired about a traffic study near Love's Travel Stop, 1301 North Warpole Street. Mayor Washburn stated that the Ohio Department of Transportation is waiting for school to resume to conduct this study in order to obtain an accurate count of the traffic in this area.

It was noted that City Council members received the credit card statements for May 2020. Mr. Roberts asked for a roll call vote of the City Council members to indicate if they have reviewed this information. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes.

Mayor Washburn recognized the recent retirement of Mrs. Darline Levering, Parks Department employee, and noted that the City will be planting a tree in one of the parks and placing a plaque near that tree in honor of Mrs. Levering.

Mayor Washburn thanked the members of City Council for their assistance in lining up the vehicles for the Senior Cruise held on Thursday, May 21, 2020. Mayor Washburn also thanked the Upper Sandusky High School Seniors, their parents, and the community for their participation and support of the cruise.
