

CITY COUNCIL

June 15, 2020

The June 15, 2020 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. via Cisco WebEx by Rick Roberts, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Don Spiegel, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, Kyle McColly, and Rick Roberts. John Walker was absent.
