

CITY COUNCIL

October 26, 2020

The October 26, 2020 special City Council meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. in the conference room at the Water Treatment Plant by Marc Mays, President. City Council members present were John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, Kyle McColly, Rick Roberts, and Don Spiegel.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Ben Buckland, Law Director; Mark Droll, City Auditor; Dave Gibson; Chris Swartz; Tom Karcher; Jeff Heffelfinger; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The purpose of this meeting was to reorganize.

It was noted that Mr. Roberts submitted his letter of resignation as President of City Council on October 20, 2020, effective immediately. Mr. Mays thanked Mr. Roberts for his service as President of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Walker, to accept the resignation of Mr. Roberts as President of City Council. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The motion unanimously carried.

Pursuant to Section 4.05 of the City's Municipal Charter, with the resignation of Mr. Roberts as President of City Council, Mr. Mays as President Pro-Tem becomes the President of City Council.

Nominations were opened for President Pro-Tem of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. Mays, seconded by Mr. Korte, to nominate Mr. McColly for President Pro-Tem of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker to close the nominations for President Pro-Tem of City Council. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried.

Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes on the nomination of Mr. McColly for President Pro-Tem of City Council. The President declared the motion carried.

Mr. Mays read his letter of resignation as President of City Council, effective immediately. Mr. Mays stated that with his work and family commitments he would not have the time necessary to be the Mayor he would have liked to be, as Mayor Washburn will be resigning at the end of this week and pursuant to Section 4.04 of the City's Charter the President of City Council becomes the Mayor.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Roberts, to accept the resignation of Mr. Mays as President of City Council. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The motion unanimously carried.

Pursuant to Section 4.05 of the City's Municipal Charter, with the resignation of Mr. Mays as President of City Council, Mr. McColly as President Pro-Tem becomes the President of City Council.

Mr. Roberts moved to open the nominations for President Pro-Tem of City Council, seconded by Mr. Korte.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts to nominate Mr. Mays as President Pro-Tem of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. McColly to nominate Mr. Korte as President Pro-Tem of City Council.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker, seconded by Mr. Roberts, to close the nominations for President Pro-Tem of City Council. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried.
