A motion was made by Mr. Wessler, seconded by Mr. Roberts, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$25,674.30. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the November 2, 2020 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

Chief MaGinn reported on the following:

- The Fire Department has responded to several carbon monoxide calls recently.
- The Fire Department has also responded to a few small fires recently.
- The Fire Department's annual food drive will be held on Saturday, December 12, 2020 from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. with Fire Department personnel to be located at the grocery stores. Donors are also able to drop off donations at the fire station.
- All three (3) pumpers will be serviced tomorrow including chassis maintenance.
- Interviews will soon be held for potential volunteer candidates.
- All meetings and most events of the Fire Department have been cancelled at this time due to COVID-19 (coronavirus).
- Most of the fire department staff has stayed healthy thru the current COVID-19 (coronavirus) pandemic.
- Tomorrow there will be a demonstration of a Victory electro static sanitizing spray system which could possibly be purchased using CARES Act funding.

Chief Ross reported on the following:

- Officer Nathan Fawcett and Officer Theodore Mason Frumkin, being the newest police officers, have started work and are currently on the road.
- The two new police cruisers are now on the road in service.
- He would like to replace the canine unit vehicle in 2021. This item has been addressed in the City's 2021 budget.
- The Winter Fantasy of Lights has begun and the Police Department is taking care of directing traffic. The weekend traffic pattern was discussed. Chief Ross thanked Mayor McColly for his assistance in directing traffic this past weekend.

Mayor McColly indicated that anyone interested in volunteering with directing traffic for the Winter Fantasy of Lights would be welcomed. Mayor McColly also noted that the police department personnel are doing a great job working with the Winter Fantasy of Lights.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
