

CITY COUNCIL

March 1, 2021

The March 1, 2021 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. at the park maintenance building in Harrison Smith Park and via zoom by Aaron Korte, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Aaron Korte, Marc Mays, Kate Niederkohr, Rick Roberts, Don Spiegel, John Walker, and Kenneth Wessler.

Others present included: Kyle McColly, Mayor; Ben Buckland, Law Director; Keith Niederkohr; Brian Hemminger, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the February 16, 2021 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker, seconded by Mr. Mays, to place Ordinance No. 104-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE THE INSTALLATION OF A DC FAST CHARGING STATION AT THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING, AND DECLARING THIS ACT AN EMERGENCY.", on its second reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 104-13 for the second time by title only.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Mays, for the adoption of Ordinance No. 104-13. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance No. 104-13 was duly adopted.

Mr. Mays reported that initial legislation addressing the operation of food trucks within the City is being prepared. The subcommittee formed to address food trucks will be meeting on Saturday with downtown business owners.

City Council members reviewed the credit card statements for February 2021.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Spiegel, to approve the February 2021 credit card statements, as presented. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried.

City Council members also reviewed the Recapitulation for January 2021.

Mayor McColly reported that Mr. Paul Wymer has resigned from the Board of Zoning Appeals, and Mr. Paul Berger will be appointed to fill Mr. Wymer's unexpired term on the Board of Zoning Appeals.

Mayor McColly thanked all of the City Departments for their efforts plowing snow during the recent winter storm and removing snow following the storm. Mayor McColly also thanked the County, Gary Huffman, Matt Bowen, and Park Enterprise for assisting with snow removal, and AJ's Heavenly Pizza for donating food for those who participated in these efforts.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting adjourned.
