

CITY COUNCIL

April 5, 2021

The April 5, 2021 City Council meeting was called to order in the administration building at the Water Reclamation Facility by Aaron Korte, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Kate Niederkohr, Rick Roberts, Don Spiegel, John Walker, Kenneth Wessler, Aaron Korte, and Marc Mays.

The minutes of the March 15, 2021 City Council meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

The minutes of the March 15, 2021 Tree Commission meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the March 15, 2021 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the March 18, 2021 Board of Zoning Appeals hearing, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

The minutes of the March 23, 2021 special Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each City Council member, were reviewed.

Residents of Brookview Subdivision addressed City Council concerning issues with flooding in the subdivision. It was noted that issues with storm water are the responsibility of the subdivision developer as the City cannot go onto private property to help resolve these issues. It was noted that this information was also presented to the Service Committee earlier this evening, and Service Committee members agreed that Mr. Dave Schneider, Collections System Supervisor, can televise the 18" storm drain to determine if there are any obstructions in the drain tile.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Walker, to place Ordinance No. 106-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS TO THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE NO. 95-13, TO MAKE APPROPRIATIONS FOR CURRENT EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE CITY OF UPPER SANDUSKY, STATE OF OHIO, DURING THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2021.", on its second reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 106-13 for the second time by title only.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Mays, for the adoption of Ordinance No. 106-13. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried and Ordinance No. 106-13 was duly adopted.

A motion was made by Mr. Walker, seconded by Mr. Mays, to place Ordinance No. 107-13 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF UPPER SANDUSKY, OHIO TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH PETERMAN ASSOCIATES, INC. TO PROVIDE SURVEY AND CIVIL ENGINEERING SERVICES FOR A FINAL LONG TERM CONTROL PLAN.", on its first reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 107-13 for the first time by title only.

City Council members reviewed the credit card statements for February 2021.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mrs. Niederkohr, to approve the credit card statements for February 2021. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The President declared the motion carried.

City Council members also reviewed the Income Tax Collections and Transient Guest Tax Collections quarterly reports as of March 31, 2021.

Mayor McColly reported that the Planning Commission is discussing changes to the City's building and zoning regulations. The possibility of adding language to prohibit certain types of establishments such as medical marijuana growing facilities and dispensaries along with paraphernalia stores, and adult novelties stores and adult dance clubs and movie theaters has been discussed. Mayor McColly asked City Council members to consider this matter and provide input at a future public hearing to be held regarding these possible changes.

There being no further business, the President declared the meeting adjourned.
