

CITY COUNCIL

May 2, 2016

The May 2, 2016 City Council meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. in Council Chambers by Don Spiegel, President. A moment of silence was observed followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America. City Council members present were Roxie Karg, Rick Roberts, Tom Shumaker, Don Spiegel, Bill Thornton, and Bob Blocksom. Scot Swinehart was absent.

Others present included: Scott Washburn, Mayor; Mark Ellis, Law Director; Mark Droll, City Auditor; Alissa Paolella, Daily Chief Union; and Sarah Bennett, Clerk.

The minutes of the April 18, 2016 Public Hearing, having been mailed to each City Council member, were approved as received.

City Council members congratulated Alissa Paolella for recently receiving the Wyandot County Community Service Award from the Mental Health Recovery Services Board of Seneca, Sandusky, and Wyandot Counties.

A motion was made by Mr. Roberts, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to place Ordinance No. 227-12 entitled, "AN ORDINANCE TO APPROVE A BID SUBMITTED FOR THE 2016 PAVING PROGRAM, AND DECLARING THIS ACT AN EMERGENCY.", on its first reading by title only. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes; the President declared the motion carried. The Clerk read Ordinance No. 227-12 for the first time by title only.

- Monday, May 9 – 7:45 p.m. – Public Hearing before City Council to hear public comments on the proposed Yard Maintenance legislation

It was noted that the annual spring clean-up throughout the City, that took place last week, went well.

Mayor Washburn recommended the approval of the appointment of Ms. Roxie Karg to the Tree Commission to fill the unexpired term of Mr. Jim Wheeler. The term will expire on December 31, 2017.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to approve the appointment of Ms. Karg to the Tree Commission with her term to expire on December 31, 2017. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Roberts indicated that on Friday, May 6, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. a Dine with the Wyandots event will be held at the John Stewart Methodist Church Family Life Center. Tickets are available for purchase from various businesses in the community.

Mr. Mark Droll reviewed the March 2016 Recapitulation with the members of City Council.
