No action was taken on the payment of bills.

The minutes of the September 10, 2018 Park Board meeting, having been mailed to each Park Board member, were approved as amended.

Park Board members reviewed the 2018 Swimming Pool Report.

Mr. Niederkohr reported that the pool house in Harrison Smith Park will be winterized soon.

Mr. Niederkohr also reported that the splash pad located in Bicentennial Park will be winterized soon by the company who installed it as part of the installation agreement for this year. Mr. Niederkohr indicated that he would like to contract the future winterization of the splash pad at an approximate cost of \$1,000.00 annually.

Mr. Blackburn indicated that the semi-trailers containing the Winter Fantasy of Lights displays and lights will be unloaded in Harrison Smith Park on Saturday, October 27, 2018. Mr. Niederkohr noted that the roads in Harrison Smith Park will closing around that same time.

A motion was made by Mr. Korte, seconded by Mr. Huffman, to enter into an executive session to discuss personnel. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried. Upon completion of the executive session, the Park Board reconvened into regular session.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
