A motion was made by Mr. Shumaker, seconded by Mr. Thornton, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$10,195.62. Upon Roll Call, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the October 5, 2015 Safety Committee minutes, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

Ms. June Hutchinson on behalf of Freedom Caregivers, 100 South Sandusky Avenue, addressed the Safety Committee and requested consideration for the first parking space on the west side of the 100 block of South Sandusky Avenue, south of Wyandot Avenue, be designated for handicap parking. Safety Committee members discussed the possibility of putting a handicap parking sign up now and stenciling the parking space after a thirty to forty-five day trial period to see if the handicap parking space will work in this location.

A motion was made by Mr. Shumaker, seconded by Mr. Thornton, to place a sign designating the first parking space on the west side of the 100 block of South Sandusky Avenue, south of Wyandot Avenue, as a handicap parking space for a thirty to forty-five day trial period. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Acting Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Roberts addressed the Safety Committee indicating that he was contacted by a concerned resident in the area of North Hazel Street regarding cars speeding between and West Church Street and West Guthrie Street. This resident requested signage be placed in the area. Safety Committee members requested the Police Department monitor the area.

It was noted that the parade and trick-or-treat held last week went well.

Chief Yeater reported that repairs on the Fire Department's aerial truck are still in progress.

Chief Yeater also reported that notice was received that the City's fire grant application was denied. Applications for the next round for the fire grant are due later this month and it is currently undecided as to what equipment the Fire Department will be applying for.

There being no further business, the Acting Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
