A motion was made by Mr. Thornton, seconded by Mr. Shumaker, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$34,105.00. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the April 4, 2016 Safety Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Safety Committee member, were approved as received.

A request was presented from Mr. Ralph Manko for the placement of a "Slow Children at Play" sign to be located along Kroger Drive. Safety Committee members agreed to take no action and requested that Police Department monitor the area.

Mr. Thornton reported that he has witnessed motorists speeding in the area of Commerce Way in the mornings. The Police Department will monitor the area.

Captain Young stated that the Fire Department was approached last week by a representative from the Upper Sandusky Chamber of Commerce concerning the possibility of the Fire Department spearheading an effort and seeking funding from the Winter Fantasy of Lights (WFOL) for a “Safety Town”. Safety Town is a program for children that teaches all aspects of child safety. A miniature village or obstacle course could be designed and children would learn about pedestrian and traffic safety by tricycling through the course. Several unanswered issues were discussed including where and how often/how long will Safety Town be held and where will it be stored when not in use. An application was submitted to the WFOL today, as this was the deadline for applications from potential recipients, but the application can be withdrawn. Safety Committee members indicated that not enough information was provided to proceed with this effort and they agreed that the application submitted for WFOL funding should be withdrawn.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
