A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Rowe, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$97,704.19. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the August 18, 2014 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Service Committee member, were approved as received.

Mr. Boes indicated that Mr. Nate Bash and Mr. Pat Stansbery, labor pool employees, are eligible for 25¢ step raises.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Rowe, to approve 25¢ step raises for Mr. Nate Bash and Mr. Pat Stansbery. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Boes was asked to contact Crane Township representatives concerning a hornets' nest that is located in Old Mission Cemetery.

Mr. Putnam indicated that he met recently with Mr. Todd Jenkins, Peterman Associates, concerning the Combined Sewer Overflow Separation Project. The size of the pipes to be utilized for the project have been determined however the locations have not determined. The project is still on schedule and there is a possibility of the City obtaining 1% funding for the project through the State. The nomination for this funding is due September 5, 2014.

Mr. Schoenberger stated that he is checking into grant funding available through the State for microcystine testing and he is currently evaluating the situation.

It was reported that Mr. Jim Shull, Water Treatment Plant employee, recently passed his Class 1 Operators License.

Mr. Boes noted that Park Enterprise is currently grinding the compost pile.

Mr. Boes reported that the Ohio Department of Transportation (ODOT) received a state bid of approximately \$140.00 per ton for road salt and this bid has been rejected. The state bid for road salt last year was \$58.00 per ton.

Mr. Searfoss reported that hydrants are being flushed from Spring Street to High Street as part of the Eighth Street repaving and waterline replacement project being done in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Transportation.

Mayor Washburn reported that he was contacted by the City's consultant for the Eighth Street repaving and waterline replacement project, being done in cooperation with the Ohio Department of Transportation, who indicated that representatives from the railroad have determined that an Ordinance is necessary to bore the water lines under the railroad. It was noted that this project is ready for this boring to take place.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
