A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Rowe, for the approval and payment of bills totaling \$129,563.37. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

The minutes of the December 15, 2014 Service Committee meeting, having been mailed to each Service Committee member, were approved as received.

Mr. Schoenberger presented bid specifications for chemicals for the Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Treatment Plant. Mr. Schoenberger requested the bidding process for these chemicals be started with the prices effective March 31, 2015.

A motion was made by Mr. Latham, seconded by Mr. Spiegel, to authorize the advertisement for chemicals for the Water Treatment Plant and Wastewater Treatment Plant. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Service Committee members reviewed a request for a street light near 103 Pheasant Run in Rivers Edge Subdivision. It was noted that the area of Pheasant Run is currently under development. Mr. Boes will contact American Electric Power to discuss a street light in this area.

Mr. Schoenberger reported that Mr. Jim Shull, Water Treatment Plant employee, obtained his Class I Operators license and is now eligible for the appropriate pay increase.

A motion was made by Mr. Spiegel, seconded by Mr. Latham, to approve the appropriate pay increase for Mr. Jim Shull as a Class I Water Plant Operator. Upon Voice Vote, all members voted Yes. The Chairman declared the motion carried.

Mr. Boes reported that the City's dump trucks have been loaded with salt/grit in preparation for the snow storm predicted for this evening.

Mr. Rowe inquired as to the status of a replacement bucket truck. Mr. Boes indicated that he is still looking for a replacement for the City's bucket truck.

There being no further business, the Chairman declared the meeting adjourned.
